Remembering Jo Ann Siever and Christian Stile

Pleasant View supports individuals at all stages of their adult lives and with different abilities. Sometimes it feels like family members and caregivers are in a secret club in which you receive the Rosetta stone and are able to understand and communicate with wonderful individuals who are often overlooked. We are truly blessed by each individual and the experiences they share with us.



Jo Ann Siever died at age 55 on March 14, 2018. She moved in 1994 to Pleasant View's Harrison House from Central Virginia Training Center. Later, she moved to Wright House and finally to her apartment in Moyers Apartments. Jo Ann enjoyed her friends, drinking coffee, attending Harrisonburg Day

Program, Trinity Presbyterian Church, Faith & Light, shopping, attending community events, and exploring the world outside of Harrisonburg whenever possible.

Jo Ann did not say many words, but clearly let those around her know how she felt and what was important to her. She enjoyed putting puzzles together, her many purses, and the treasures she carried in her purses. She also enjoyed people and people enjoyed her. She leaves behind many people who cared for her through the years and still think of her today.



Christian Stile died June 17, 2018 at age 24. He moved to Pleasant View, Inc.'s Harrison House after graduating from High School in 2014. Upon meeting Christian, the first thing one noticed was his big brown eyes and smile. Pastor Dave Gullman shared that when he

visited Christian recently in the hospital, unsure how he would find Christian feeling, he was greeted by an "ear to ear smile." Dave intended to encourage Christian, but was moved and blessed himself by Christian's joy in seeing him. Christian



was youthfully "all arms and legs" and sometimes had a problem controlling his movement, but he shared his sense of humor with those who cared for him by laughing when he accidently hit something or someone. Those who cared for him at Harrison House marveled at how, upon waking up, he would smile and laugh. Christian's vocalizations, joy, and sense of wonder are missed. In his short time on earth he impacted everyone who met him. We are thankful we were blessed by knowing him.

I started working for Pleasant View and before long, I decided that I believed so much in what they stand for that I wanted to start giving back. I was raised to care about all people, but have tended to focus on those who fall through the cracks. My inspiration is my grandmother, Ellen Watts, who took in multiple foster kids and always taught them and her children that there is no substitute for compassion. Some needs that would qualify are adaptive equipment like Liftware spoons for individuals who struggle with feeding themselves but still want to try. •
