


Program Spotlight: Brenneman House

Louk House has two



accessible vans with ramps for small trips. When everyone wants to go on a trip together, they use a larger vehicle that has a lift and room for two or more people who use wheelchairs. These vehicles are essential for the individuals we support to enjoy happy and healthy lives. The Department of Rail and Public Transportation FTA 5310 grant funds 80% of the cost of the vehicles. The community match of 10% sometimes comes from KOVAR, community grants, or individual donations.

Birthdays are also a big deal at Pleasant View. Many individuals who move here from Central Virginia Training Center had never celebrated their

birthdays before. We help individuals plan their holidays and birthday celebrations in their own ways. Marshall (right) celebrates his birthday with a Zombie theme. He especially loved the balloon zombie.
