## Supported Employment Spotlight: Crystal Carr By Pam Miller

Every Thursday morning, you can hear the intermittent hum of the paper shredding machine at the Harrisonburg Day Program. For the past three and a half years, Crystal Carr has been one of our three Pleasant View employees charged with the important task of shredding papers with information that cannot go in the trash. When visiting on this early spring day, Crystal was more than happy to show me all the elements of her job.

Crystal first showed me the shredder. The original paper shredding machine Crystal used, often overheated. In 2019, Peggy Secrist and Donna Click were awarded a grant from Pleasant View's **Richard and Helen DeButts Dream Endowment** to purchase a commercial grade paper shredder for our shredding positions. Before purchasing the commercial grade shredder, we went through several lower grade shredders.

Crystal and one of our job coaches work together to safely use and maintain the paper shredder. Paper clips and staples are removed from documents in the shred box to make sure the machine blades do not get damaged. When the bags are full, Crystal and her job coach turn off and unplug the machine, tie up the bag, and sweep the little bits of shredded paper that fall to the floor in the process. Crystal and her fellow paper shredders play an important part in keeping individuals' information secure.


