

YEARS OF CARING

Pleasant View grew out of a concern many families in the Virginia Mennonite Conference had in the late 1960's – what would happen to their family member with intellectual and developmental disabilities if they were no longer able to care for him/her?

The doors to our first home, now known as Turner House, opened in March 1971. Through the intervening years, Pleasant View has grown from a six-person group home to a multidimensional agency with ten different programs that serve individuals through a variety of services and supports. Although many come from all areas of Virginia and beyond, the majority are from the Harrisonburg/Rockingham community. Many religious backgrounds are represented from all walks of faith.

Our Residential Support Services



Supports in All services may include:

- ◇ Self-care
- ◇ Medical Support
- ◇ Personal Finance

We also support individuals participating in:

Group Homes provide 24-hour, 7 days a week family-style support to adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities in homes located in Harrisonburg City and Rockingham County, Virginia neighborhoods. Supports are based on each person's personal goals, preferences, and needs.

In **Sponsored Residential Home Service**, 1-2 individuals with developmental disabilities live in a home with a provider licensed through Pleasant View and are an integrated part of the family. The family provides support to the individuals and may employ additional direct support professionals to assist with support.



Harrison Residence Intermediate Care Facility for Individuals with Intellectual Disabilities (ICF-IID) provides intensive, individualized training to individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities and at least one other disability. This home is fully wheelchair accessible.



Pleasant View, Inc. Residential Support Services help individuals who have developmental and intellectual disabilities to live in and enrich their communities.

In-Home Service provides intermittent support to individuals living in their own homes. Supports address activities of daily living.

Supervised Living Residential Service provides support to individuals up to 24 hours daily in a Pleasant View setting. Supports are designed to enable individuals to live in a community-based residential setting while they receive individualized support to develop or maintain their highest level of ability.
